Attention Parents: Here is our updated OMS Dress Code for 2016-2017 (for all school shopping over the summer)

1. Shirts should be long enough to fully cover the midriff and all undergarments.

- 2. Sleeveless shirts with a collar may be worn.
- 3. See-through blouses are acceptable dress as long as students wear a tank top underneath and undergarments are NOT visible.
- Logos or images depicting inappropriate or vulgar language, sex (including innuendo or sexual overtones), drugs, alcohol, or tobacco products, or those that have been identified by the school as gang related, are not permitted at school.
- 5. Pants, shorts, and skirts <u>must be worn at the natural waist</u>, not showing underwear, <u>no shorter than three inches above the knee</u>, and not so long, so tight or wide that they cause a distraction, disruption, or safety hazard. <u>No spandex, leggings, yoga pants or exercise tights</u>. Leggings may be worn to school only if they are covered by a dress/tunic meeting the 3 inch above the knee rule. Leggings may not be worn under shorts not meeting the dress code requirement. If pants have holes or slits, the holes or slits must not reveal skin. Pajamas are not acceptable dress. Students with a habit of wearing pants too large to remain at the waist could be placed on a special dress code whereby they will be expected to wear a belt and tuck in their shirt.
- 6. Students must wear shoes at all times during the school day. Sneakers are needed for PE class. Bedroom slippers are not appropriate for school.
- 7. Students may wear sunglasses, hats, or other protective wear while outdoors. Hats and sunglasses are not to be worn in the building at any time. Violations will result in hats or sunglasses being confiscated, sent to the office, and must be picked up by a parent or guardian.
- Gym Class: Students will be required to change for gym class into clothing and sneakers suitable for athletics. Gym clothing must meet the specifications given by the coaches.
