Florida Standards Assessment



In Florida, we have adopted the Florida Standards. Now, instead of taking FCAT, we will be giving the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA).

This will result in a significant increase in the level of rigor associated with these standards. Other states who have administered new standardized tests based on more rigorous standards saw a 20 percent decrease in proficiency rates during the first year of administration. Additionally, the writing portion (previously administered in fourth,

eighth and tenth grade) will be administered in all grades four-eleven, and will be administered on the computer.

During this transitional period, we have planned several changes in order to be prepared. First, we will offer 90 minutes of online reading and math, using the iReady program. Second, we will use the HMH (English) program one day a week in the computer lab (so kids can experience typing regularly on the computer). We plan to add a component to our history classes to address writing using primary and secondary source documents. We also plan to open our computer labs an hour before school starts daily to allow parents an opportunity for students to access these web-based features.

Osceola Middle School is committed to adding technological resources to meet the new demands of online learning and testing. For this reason, we continue to add devices and opportunities for students to use the technology they posses to respond to demand. It may, however, mean that students will have some homework tasks to complete online outside of class time. Please speak to the teachers for accommodations in the event that online resources are not available at home.

Shirts should be long enough to fully cover the midriff and all undergarments. Sleeves must completely cover the shoulders and made of a non-see through fabric. Sleeveless shirts with a collar may be worn (providing it covers the shoulders). Sheer shirts or lace tops will be permitted as long as an undershirt is worn and no undergarments are visible. Shirts with spaghetti straps or bare midriffs, tank tops, and shirts with low necklines are not acceptable.

OMS Bullying Policy

Osceola Middle School teachers and staff work to provide a safe and secure environment for our students. OMS does not tolerate bullying or harassment of any type.

According to the Okeechobee County School Board Policy, bullying is defined as: "SYSTEMATICALLY and CHRONICALLY inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or employees. It is further defined as unwanted and repeated written, verbal, graphic or physical behavior."

If your OMS student feels uncomfortable in school, he or she can report it anonymously. Forms are located in the main office, media center and the dean's office. Students may discreetly pick up a form and place it in the box in one of the above locations. All incidents reported in these locations will be thoroughly investigated. If disciplinary action is necessary, parents will be notified and consequences will be handled in accordance to the Okeechobee Code of Student Conduct.
