Involving Parents

The school will make automated phone calls when necessary to inform parents of the events that are taking place at the school. The school will also use the Remind application to inform subscribed parents of upcoming events. In addition to calling home and using Remind, we will be sending home a monthly Warrior newsletter, that will have all the information parents will need to be involved. The Parental Involvement Committee is responsible for hosting at least four events throughout the school year. The Committee will hold two planning meetings prior to each event held. Two weeks prior to the planning meeting, notices will be sent home to invite parents to participate in our planning meetings.

Parent Meetings

Meeting will be held no sooner than 6:00pm so parents who have conflicting schedules will be able to attend the meetings. If some parents request morning meetings, then the school will be able to consider that as a possibility. We will also ensure that all the parents who have given their e-mail addresses to the Parental Involvement Committee will receive all the notes from the meetings.

Supporting Partnerships

Osceola Middle School will build the capacity for strong parental involvement by providing access to an open computer lab at the school at least one time per week. Parents are invited to come and use the lab to check Skyward, support academic programs such as i-Ready, or use the computers for personal use. Other parent involvement activities will include academic nights focusing on Reading, Science & Science Fair, and student test scores and standardized tests.

The school will monitor that the information was provided through end-of-year climate surveys and parent feedback.

Full Participation in all School Activities

Osceola Middle School will provide opportunities for parental participation through many methods. A member of the Parental Involvement Committee is bi-lingual; she will translate as needed during the meetings. All parents will be receiving e-mails/letters and
